LATE LUNCH ORDERS

Unfortunately, late lunch orders cannot be accepted – no exceptions.

Due dates are clearly indicated on the lunch order forms and forms are sent home with ample time for return. Order forms are usually sent to parents 1-2 weeks before start date. Keeping track on your calendar at home of the last lunch date for the previous order can help you determine when the new order is coming. Cycle 2 Lunch orders will be sent to parents in early-mid December for the new year. Please appreciate and respect that the co-ordination of the lunch orders and incoming funds for almost 500 students is a substantial job. Providing this service to families is done strictly by a couple of volunteers who spend many hours in the preparation and delivery of the lunch program. Adhering to a time limit is necessary so that our volunteers can organize and meet their deadlines without having to continuously update orders. As always, volunteers are always welcome to assist with any of our lunch programs if on the approved volunteer list.

SCHOOL CASH ONLINE



If you have not already done so, be sure to sign up for School Cash Online. This is our preferred method of

payment for all school fundraising including lunch days and field trips. School Cash Online allows you to pay with your debit or credit card. Follow these steps to get started:

1. Go to simcoecounty.schoolcashionline.com or from our school website click on "Pay Fees"
2. Register and add your child to the newly created account
3. View and purchase items through e-check or credit card

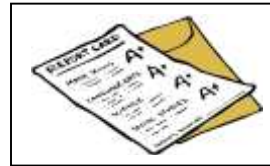
END OF DAY PROCEDURE

Please remember that the regular school day at Minesing begins at 9:10 a.m. and ends at 3:30 p.m. Students who are to be dismissed before regular dismissal time require a note for the teacher, dated

and signed by a parent. If you pick your child up from school at dismissal, please do so promptly at 3:30 as there is no supervision after that time.

Last minute phone calls at the end of the day regarding early dismissal, alternate end of day pick-up, or alternate bus arrangements should be avoided unless it is an emergency. The end of the day can be a very busy time both in the office and your child's teacher who is wrapping up the day with homework assignments and agenda information. Minimal disruption is appreciated.

PARENT PORTAL



Parent Portal gives parents real-time access to attendance and grade information.

The SCDSB Parent Portal is a secure online tool that provides parents/guardians (of students less than 18 years of age) with quick access to their children's attendance and grades and includes the option to sign up for email notifications. To access the Parent Portal, parents/guardians will need their child's SCDSB Pupil ID Number as well as an Access ID. The Access ID was provided in a sealed letter in September with instructions on how to create an account. If you lose the Access ID, visit us in the school office and we'll provide it to you after verifying your identity.

PARKING AT MINESING SCHOOL

SAFE ARRIVAL

When your child is going to be absent or late on a school day, please call the office "Safe Arrival" line and leave a message to let us know. If we do not hear from you our Safe Arrival system will call you and remind you to call the school because we do not know where your child is. Your child's safety is our first concern!

Please remember it is your responsibility to call the school to report your child's absence or late arrival. Messages can be left on the Safe Arrival line anytime by calling 705-728-1944 and then press 1.

BUS CANCELLATION INFORMATION



All information regarding cancelled buses in Simcoe County is posted on the Simcoe County Student Transportation Consortium's bus

information website at www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca. Our school is in the **Central Zone**. When buses are cancelled, schools remain open for student learning, unless otherwise noted. If you drive your child to school when buses are cancelled you must be available to them pick up in the event of early school closure.

The Consortium and bus operators try to make the decision to cancel school buses before 6 a.m. and make every effort to post announcements before 7 a.m. Inclement weather cancellations are effective for the whole day and buses cancelled in the morning will not run at the end of the day. Our school has moved to an automated safe arrival system. The first parent/guardian listed in the student file will receive an automated call on days when buses are cancelled if their child isn't at school.

The recording will tell you that you do not need to call the school back unless your child should be at school.

MATH CORNER

Inspiring Your Child to Love and Learn Math

Did you know?

- Research shows that early math literacy helps children to succeed in school and improves their future career.
- 70 percent of Canada's top jobs require science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) education.

This includes careers we may not expect, such as culinary arts, animation and fitness.

- When children are positively engaged and successful, they are more likely to stick with an activity and keep searching for a solution to a problem.
- Early success in problem-solving will build your child's confidence.

Why "Mathitude" Matters

*Positive thinking:

Students who are encouraged to have a positive attitude about math from an early age will develop positive feelings about the subject.

*Keep them engaged:

Students who are engaged in the learning process will learn more and be open to further learning.

***Motivation:** Students who believe that math is important for their future will be more motivated to learn math.

***Build confidence:** Students who feel confident in their own ability to do well in math will be more likely to perform well.

Report an Incident

The SCDSB has an online Safe Schools Reporting Tool, which is available on our school

website homepage, <http://scdsb.on.ca/ReportAnIncident> as a Quick Access

button. Students and parents can use this tool to submit a report online if they witness a student engaged in inappropriate behaviour such as bullying, drug use or vandalism. Students are still encouraged to speak to a trusted adult at school or home if they have any concerns. This form isn't a substitute for having a discussion with your teacher or principal. Student safety and well-being is our top priority.

CHILD & YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH WALK-IN CLINICS

New Path offering child and youth mental health walk-in clinics

In response to the increasing wait times for child and youth mental health services, and the increased need for such services, New Path has undertaken a service redesign that will provide more timely and responsive services to children, youth and families in Simcoe County. New Path now offers Child and Youth Mental Health Walk-In Clinics in five office locations throughout Simcoe County: Bradford, Alliston, Barrie, Collingwood and Orillia.

Children, youth and families requesting service from New Path no longer need to call and complete an intake; they can simply attend one of the local Walk-In Clinics and will receive a single session intervention that day. Should children or youth require further service, New Path will continue to offer a wide variety of community and school-based services as well as residential service and women's service. TREATIES RECOGNITION WEEK

Did you know we are ALL treaty people? Treaties Recognition Week is the first week of November every year - this year it's Nov. 5 to 11. The Simcoe County District School Board is located on territory covered by several pre-confederation treaties - Treaty 5, 16, 18, 19 and 82, as well as the 1923 William's Treaty.



Treaties Recognition Week was introduced in 2016 to honour the importance of treaties and to help Ontarians learn more about treaty rights and treaty relationships. VOLUNTARY SELF-IDENTIFICATION OF FIRST NATION, METIS OR INUIT

Self-identification is a personal choice to disclose First Nation, Métis or Inuit ancestry. The choice to self-identify is up to you and does not require proof of documentation (i.e. no status card), regardless of where you live. Self-identification is confidential, securely stored and used only to support First Nation, Métis and Inuit student success. Self-identification helps schools support the needs of First Nation, Métis and Inuit students and their achievement. Student achievement data is collected and protected with other confidential data used to help improve student achievement.



To self-identify your child as First Nation, Métis or Inuit, check off the First Nation, Métis or Inuit box on the school registration form and write in details if applicable. The SCDSB is committed to meeting the learning needs of First Nation, Métis and Inuit students through responsive programming and services. Past activities have included: the inclusion of First Nation, Métis and Inuit focused resources in schools; school based pow wows; dedicated First Nation, Métis and Inuit student advisors and cultural

FREE PRESCRIPTION DRUG COVERAGE FOR CHILDREN

Beginning Jan. 1, 2018, the province will provide free prescription drug coverage for children and youth aged 24 and under, regardless of family income. Under OHIP+, Ontario children and youth will have access to over 4,400 medications and other drug products. Enrollment in OHIP+ will be automatic, based on age. There are no upfront costs, no co-payment and no annual deductible. Those who are eligible for OHIP+ will only need their health card number and a valid prescription from their doctor or nurse practitioner when they visit their pharmacist. UPDATE YOUR CHILD'S IMMUNIZATION RECORDS

The Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit is required to keep up to date immunization records for all students who attend elementary or secondary school in the County of Simcoe and the District of Muskoka. Parents are responsible for reporting immunizations to the health unit each time their child receives a vaccine from their health care provider. 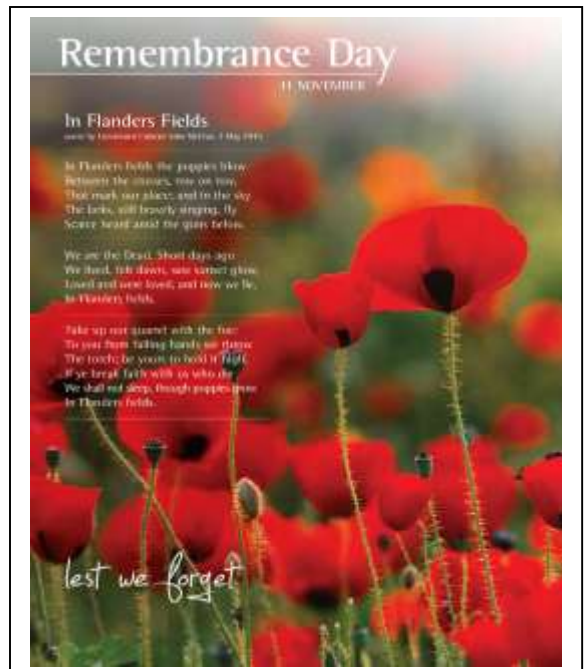
