MATH CORNER




Homework Help is an online tool for students to access real-time Mathematics tutoring. The project is funded by the Ministry of Education, delivered by qualified Ontario Mathematics teachers and is without cost.

It allows students to get help after school hours, when teachers or parents are unavailable to help. It can help students with answering homework questions, reviewing material from previous grades, and studying for tests, exams or the EQAO tests. But remember – it is “homework help” not “homework do” – the tutors are there to support the students and work through questions to help them be more confident learners and better understand the math.

Students can register for the program by completing the online registration form at the Homework Help website (<http://homeworkhelp.ilc.org>). Please note that students require their Ontario Education Number (OEN) to register, located on all report cards.

PERSONAL STUDENT INFORMATION



As students progress from elementary school to secondary school, important personal student information is shared which eases each student’s transition to secondary school. Sharing this information also

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Minesing Central is now registering children for Kindergarten for the 2018-19 school year. If your child turns four this year then they’re ready for Junior Kindergarten!

LUNCH PROGRAM

-Lunch order forms are sent to parents via email. You may print a paper copy and submit with payment OR purchase through the School Cash Online system. Online payment orders are due at **NOON** on the due date.



-If a **snow day** falls on a day that you ordered lunch, that lunch will be made up on the week following the **END** of the current lunch order period.

-There are no refunds for lunches missed due to absence. If you wish to pick up your absent child’s ordered lunch, you may do so between 1:00-1:10. If


you wish to have a sibling pick up the lunch, please arrange with your child in the morning before they leave for school. The office cannot make these arrangements for you.

- Make note in your calendar of the weeks that you have ordered lunches for your child and ensure that your child is aware.

- If your child believes they should receive a lunch and did not, they should report to the lunch monitor (parent) in the main hallway immediately so the issue can be immediately resolved. Our lunch monitor parents are there to help.

STUDENT CONCUSSION PROTOCOL

The Ministry of Education expects all school boards in Ontario to develop and maintain a policy on concussion. The Ontario Physical and Health Education Association (Ophea) has developed a concussion protocol as part of the Ontario Physical Education Safety Guidelines.



Recent research has made it clear that a concussion can have a significant impact on a student's cognitive and physical abilities. In fact, research shows that activities that require concentration can actually cause a student's concussion symptoms to

reappear or worsen. It is equally important to develop strategies to assist students as they "return to learn" in the classroom as it is to develop strategies to assist them "return to physical activity".

Before a student with a suspected concussion can return to school, the parent/guardian must complete a "Student Medical Clearance Following Suspected Concussion" Form and return it to the Principal. This helps us to meet the needs of the injured student.

MARCH BREAK CHILD CARE



The Simcoe County District School Board (SCDSB) supports your child care needs by offering full-day child care programs in select schools across Simcoe County on PA Days and school holidays. Over 30 of our

schools offer child care programs for children from Junior Kindergarten to 12 years of age, including care over March Break (March 12 to 16). The daily fee is \$34.20 and a fee subsidy may be available to families who qualify. Registration in advance is required. Please contact the child care operator directly to register. CHILD & YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH WALK-IN CLINICS



New Path now offers Child and Youth Mental Health Walk-In Clinics in five office locations throughout Simcoe County: Alliston, Barrie, Bradford,

Collingwood and Orillia. The Walk-In Clinic provides a single session to children, youth and families who require support for emotional, relationship or behavioural challenges. The Walk-In Clinic can be accessed by children, youth and families as often as they require support.
